

The Crown Energy Security Division plans and supports the energy transition for Saskatchewan's Crown sector. The Division facilitates mid-to-long term policy and planning for electricity, natural gas and nuclear energy, manages federal-provincial-territorial Crown-related energy matters, engages with industrial and business interests, and advances economic opportunities associated with the energy transition in the province. The Division:

- *leads energy projects that are multi-agency and transformative;*
- *conducts energy sector economic, modelling, and policy analysis, and;*
- *coordinates policy and planning for nuclear energy.*

Energy Economist

Reporting to the Director, Energy Transition, this position works with a high level of independence and work as a team advising on long-term energy planning, capturing economic opportunities, advancing systems design, and analyzing energy solutions. This position offers an opportunity for meaningful and challenging work in an encouraging and dynamic environment that promotes trust, excellence, leadership, and teamwork.

This position will:

- Forecast, calculate, retrieve, analyze or synthesize data, and communicate its potential implications for public policy, economic growth, or energy systems planning.
- Develop or employ economic models and methods to help assess policy options.
- Assess models, methods, or analytic techniques used by other governments and the private sector.
- Collaborate and coordinate with similar experts in the commercial Crowns and executive government, as well as participate in or lead related working groups.
- Support Crown sector engagement with the private sector.

To be successful in this position you will maintain effective working relationships with all CIC units/divisions and stakeholders, including individuals within Crown corporations and Executive Government, to ensure effective communication and best possible analysis and advice.

Qualifications and skills requirements include:

- Preferably a graduate degree in economics, statistics, engineering, or actuarial sciences. Equivalent combination of education and experience will be considered.
- Awareness of fossil fuels, energy alternatives, trade and finance, in an economic context.
- Highly developed research and analytical skills.
- Experience with economic methodologies and relevant software programs, and especially those used in or relevant to energy systems planning.
- Solid understanding of micro and macro-economic theory and techniques.
- Experience sourcing, managing, and assessing economic and energy data.
- Demonstrated leadership potential, especially collaborating with others and working in teams.

Qualifications and skill requirements include:

- Preferably a graduate degree in public policy, economics, engineering, business, social sciences or humanities, with experience managing strategic issues in government. Equivalent combination of education and experience will be considered.
- Demonstrated leadership qualities and management skills, including the ability to work independently in a collaborative environment and as a leader of a team.
- Strong skills in influencing, analysis, synthesis, problem solving, writing, and presenting.
- Ability to work independently and proactively on dynamic, complicated, and sensitive issues.
- Ability to work collaboratively, build relationships, and value the perspectives of others.
- Fluency with Microsoft Office suite, including comfort with basic data and financials.
- Experience in or knowledge of the public sector in Saskatchewan is an asset.
