The Internal Audit unit operates under a shared audit services model and provides internal audit services to multiple organizations across the public sector. The unit delivers on a diverse portfolio of assurance, advisory, and compliance engagements that focus on assisting each organization's management and Board of Directors with understanding, improving, and sustaining an environment of good corporate governance, risk management, and internal control.

Senior Auditor

As a result of a recent internal promotion, CIC is seeking two experienced audit professionals to join our Internal Audit team as Senior Auditors. These positions provide an opportunity to work on meaningful and varied audit engagements, collaborate with leaders across multiple organizations, and contribute to continuous improvement in governance, risk management, and internal controls. These positions work with a high level of independence and are responsible for leading a variety of audit projects simultaneously.

The successful candidates will bring strong communication and leadership skills, along with the ability to think critically and objectively to reach reasoned conclusions.

This position works closely with different functional areas and individuals at all levels of four different organizations. The ability to develop and maintain effective working relationships within and outside of CIC will be key to being successful in this role.

Key responsibilities include:

- Planning and conducting audit assignments including proposing an audit approach; documenting business processes; conducting risk and control assessments; developing and conducting audit testing procedures; reporting and presenting audit results; providing recommendations and opportunities for improvements; and following up on management plans for corrective action.
- Coordinating and performing quarterly and annual financial controls testing.
- Coaching and mentoring junior Internal Audit team members, as applicable.
- Providing internal control expertise and representing Internal Audit on project teams, at management and/or Board meetings, and to external organizations, as required.
- Working collaboratively with external auditors, the Provincial Auditor, and/or other regulatory/review bodies.
- Participating in continuous innovation and improvement to Internal Audit operations and services.

The following competencies are essential for this position:

- Applied knowledge of internal auditing principles, practices, and techniques.
- Applied knowledge of the IIA's Global Internal Audit Standards.
- Experience in analysing complex processes, evaluating financial and operational information or systems, and drawing logical conclusions.
- Strong analytical, critical thinking, and problem-solving skills.
- Effective communication skills, both oral and written.
- Well-developed organizational and time management skills.

- Ability to handle several audit assignments simultaneously and work with minimal supervision.
- Strong computer skills and familiarity with the Microsoft Office suite.

The ideal candidate will have an undergraduate degree in Commerce/Business Administration or a related discipline; a professional designation in auditing (e.g. CIA; CRMA; or CISA) or accounting (e.g. CPA); and a minimum of 4 years of audit experience.

- Having, or commitment towards, a CIA designation is an asset.
- Internal Audit experience in the public sector is an asset.

Travel within the province is required. This generally includes day trips to Moose Jaw, with other travel required infrequently. A valid Class 5 driver's licence will be a condition of employment.

The successful candidate will be subject to an Enhanced Security Check as a condition of employment.

CIC is looking to fill two (2) permanent, full-time positions.

CIC encourages applications from candidates who bring strong audit experience and meet many of the qualifications for this role. Where a candidate does not fully meet all Senior Auditor requirements, CIC may consider appointment at an appropriate classification, with salary aligned to the candidate's qualifications, experience, and demonstrated competencies.
